# HOW TO BID

## ONLINE:

Before the traditional auction starts, bids may be placed on [bruun-rasmussen.com](http://bruun-rasmussen.com). You can enter a bid and follow the bidding right up until three hours before the start of the traditional auction at Baltikavej in Copenhagen. You will automatically be notified if you are being outbid. The traditional auction is based on the highest bid made online.

## ATTEND THE AUCTION IN PERSON:

You can register for the auction at Baltikavej 30 minutes before it begins. Each participant is assigned a bidding number. The auction will be in Danish and English, and please note that bids and invoices are communicated in Danish kroner.

## LIVE BIDDING:

You can follow the auction live via video and audio transmission and submit bids from our website, as if you were in the saleroom. Your bids will be treated the same way as bids submitted in the saleroom. When the auction begins, go to our website and click on the orange “live” icon next to the auction in question.

## COMMISSION BIDS:

If you are unable to attend the auction in person, either in the saleroom or via Live Bidding, you can submit a commission bid, whereby a commission agent from Bruun Rasmussen will bid on your behalf during the auction. Commission bids may be submitted via our website next to the description of the item in question right up until the start of the auction. Commission bids may also be placed via telephone, email, letter or fax up until 24 hours before the start of the auction.

## TELEPHONE BIDS:

Bids may also be made by telephone. We will call you from the saleroom and bid on your behalf. You can book this service on our website next to the item in question, or contact our staff on [bids@bruun-rasmussen.dk](mailto:bids@bruun-rasmussen.dk) minimum three hours before the start of the auction.

## PAYMENT AND COLLECTION:

Items purchased at auction may be paid for and collected on the day of the auction at Baltikavej 10.

## Pauca Sed Bona

Rarely have the above words rung more true, since Ulrik Lauridsen's collection may be small when measured solely in size, but I can say in all sincerity that I have never before presented a catalogue where the average level of quality has been as high as in the present publication.

Highlighting individual lots in a collection, where all of them are as exquisite as they are here, is not fair. Conversely, any collector, regardless of their interest, should treat themselves to a "lesson" in how coins MIGHT look. View for instance the copper coins from 1740 (cat. no. 49 and 50), the 12 skilling with a portrait of Frederik V (cat. no. 51) or the 50 Franc in gold from 1904 (cat. no. 102).

That the auction for coins from the former Danish possessions in the Caribbean coincides with the 100th anniversary of the sale of the islands could not be more appropriate, and of course it is a great pleasure to be able to offer Lauridsen's impressive collection of Ducats at the same time.


For now, I will allow myself to congratulate the future owners of the beautiful coins from this catalogue and then yield my space to Ulrik Lauridsen himself.

# Pure Enjoyment

## *The Danish West Indies*



I think that what made me a collector of coins from the Danish West Indies, was a fascination of the ties between the islands and Denmark, their amazing but also cruel history, and the exotic influence that is expressed in the coins' beautiful features. My first serious purchase of Danish West Indian coins was made in 1996, but my interest in numismatics was aroused already when I was 8-9 years old in the mid-1960s and was visiting my grandmother in Højslev Kirkeby near Skive. She was a collector of Danish coins – her oldest was probably a Frederik VII speciedaler from 1849. A guest in her home that came by every now and then was the eponymous Frovin Sieg (coin dealer and author of Denmark's first coin price guide), who lived nearby and brought his spirit duplicated sales lists with him on his visits. I read these with great zeal.

As my collection was expanded, I acquired doublets when a coin in a better condition than the one I had was for sale. It was about striving for the finest material. The doublet collection that arose from this approach to collecting was sold at Bruun Rasmussen's auction 852 in November of 2014.

## *Danish Gold Ducats*

As the opportunities to buy ever-finer Danish West Indian pieces were exhausted, the Danish gold Ducats from the 16-1700 century caught my interest. I especially found Anton Meybusch's die cutting on the Christian V and Frederik IV coins completely irresistible. His Guinea-Ducats with slave ships and the Fort Christiansborg also represent a direct connection to the Danish West Indies, since it was from Danish Guinea that the slave ships set sail for the Caribbean plantations. In this way, my small collection ended up reflecting the historic reality between three continents.

In recent years I placed an emphasis on the purchase of Danish gold Ducats, and the interest was no longer limited to Christian V and Frederik IV's coins – as can be seen with a few foreign "Pharisees" that have snuck into the collection.

## *The Joy*

For me the coin collecting has been the source of immense joy and inspiration; the joy of the acquisition, the individual coin's beauty and artistic craftsmanship, the subsequent reflection on historical and social contexts and the circumstances of the coins production and so on. In addition, I have not least experienced the joy of the personal relationships with other coin collectors, dealers and specialists at the auction houses.

I am quite sure that it is not only the coins that will be handed over to the lucky new owners and collector-colleagues at this auction, but also the *joy*. The same joy that you, who in the year 2117 or 2217 might be holding this little catalogue in your hands and find out that one of your coins has belonged to me, might feel. Take good care of my little treasures!

Finally, a big thanks goes to Michael Fornitz and Mogens Hansen from Bruun Rasmussen. Their friendly help and courtesy over the years has made the enjoyment of collecting even greater. To the former, I also want to say a warm thank you for the insightful and dedicated work in preparing this beautiful catalogue.

At auktionen over mønter fra de tidligere danske besiddelser i Vestindien netop falder sammen med 100-året for afhændelsen af disse, kunne ikke være mere passende, og det er naturligvis en stor fornøjelse ved samme lejlighed at udbyde Lauridsens fornemme dukatsamling.



# Rendyrket glæde

## Dansk Vestindien



Jeg tror, at det som gjorde mig til samler af mønter fra Dansk Vestindien, var fascinationen af øernes tilknytning til Danmark, deres fantastiske, men også grusomme, historie, og det eksotiske islæt, der giver sig udtryk i mønternes smukke præg. Mine første seriøse indkøb af dansk vestindiske mønter blev gjort i 1996, men interessen for numismatikken blev vakt, da jeg som 8-9-årig i midten af 1960'erne var på besøg hos min mormor i Højslev Kirkeby ved Skive. Hun samlede på danske mønter – den ældste vistnok en Frederik VII-speciedaler fra 1849. I hendes hjem kom i ny og næ den navnkundige Frovin Sieg (mønthandler og forfatter til Danmarks første møntpriskatalog), der boede i nærheden, og som medbragte sine spritduplikerede salgslistér. Disse læste jeg med stor iver.

I takt med at samlingen blev udbygget, tilkøbte jeg dubletter, når det hændte, at en mønt blev udbudt i en bedre kvalitet, end den jeg allerede havde. Det handlede om en stræben efter det ypperste materiale. Den derved opståede dubletsamling blev solgt på Bruun Rasmussens auktion 852 i november 2014.

## Danske Gulddukater

Efterhånden som mulighederne for at købe stadig bedre dansk vestindiske stykker blev udtømt, fangedes min interesse af danske gulddukater fra 16-1700-tallet. Specielt fandt jeg Anton Meybuschs stempelskærerarbejder på Christian V- og Frederik IV-mønterne helt uimodstælige. Samtidig udgjorde hans Guinea-dukater med slaveskibene og fortet Christiansborg en direkte forbindelse til Dansk Vestindien, da det var herfra slavetransporterne til de vestindiske plantager udgik. På den måde endte min lille samling med at afspejle den historiske virkelighed mellem tre kontinenter.

I de seneste år er hovedvægten lagt på indkøb af danske gulddukater, og interessen begrænsedes ikke længere udelukkende til Christian V og Frederik IV's mønter. Som det fremgår, har også enkelte udenlandske "farisæere" sneget sig ind.

## Glæden

For mig har møntsamlert været til uendelig glæde og inspiration; glæden ved erhvervelsen, den enkelte mønts skønhed samt kunstneriske og håndværksmæssige kvaliteter, den efterfølgende refleksion over historiske og sociale sammenhænge og produktionsmæssige omstændigheder osv. Desuden har jeg ikke mindst oplevet glæden i de menneskelige relationer til andre møntsamlere, handlere og specialister i auktionshusene.

Jeg er helt sikker på, at det ikke blot er mønterne, der overdrages til de heldige nye ejere og samlerkolleger ved denne auktion, men også *glæden*. Samme glæde, som du, der måske i år 2117 eller 2217 sidder med dette lille katalog i hånden og opdager, at en af dine mønter har været min, føler. Tag fortsat godt vare på mine små skatte!

Til slut en stor tak til Michael Fornitz og Mogens Hansen fra Bruun Rasmussen, hvis venlige hjælp og imødekommenhed gennem årene har gjort samlerformøjelsen endnu større. Til førstnævnte desuden en varm tak for indsigtfuldt og dedikeret arbejde med udarbejdelsen af dette smukke katalog.
